Plus in the novice category the same day we won; gold in U57kgs Roxie*, u60kgs Oscar*, u90kgs Joe*, over 90s Jack*, Silver u78kgs Grace*, bronze u73 Alex*. On the Saturday in the individuals for kyu and dan grades the medal haul was; Black belt, gold u70kgs Anika, Silver u60kgs Adam, bronze u52kgs Lien, u63kgs*, Evie, u66kgs Gergo u73kgs Sam.

Kyu grades (leading to black belt but not yet) gold u66kgs Ammar*, u73kgs Ralf*, u81kgs Bowen*, u90kgs Ollie*, Silver u63kgs Rebecca*, u66kgs Jack*, bronze u63kgs Rebecca*. There were quite a number of places just outside the medals, which I won't put down. Many of the kyu grade students have only been training for around a year. Those marked with an asterisk come under my teaching, others are on the High Performance Programme. A very proud weekend, hard work for all those connected to it!
